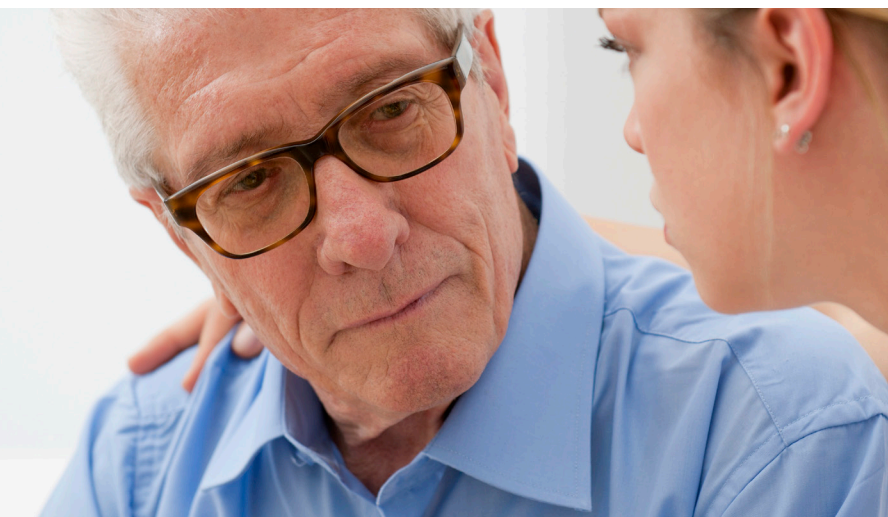

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Our patients receive a minimum of three hours of physical, occupational and speech therapy Monday through Friday. Saturday therapy is as needed and as determined by the physician. Other services are provided as needed in addition to the three hours of therapy during the week.

This program currently cannot accommodate patients who are ventilator dependent, comatose, have severe burns, unstable labs, complete spinal cord injury at level C5 or higher or require respiratory isolation. Referral sources, patients and family members will be offered alternative placement options when those referred do not meet the admission requirements to the program. Patients must be 18 years of age or older for admission.

PAYOR SOURCE INFORMATION

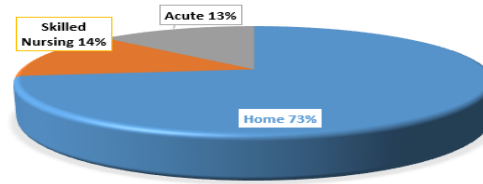
Medicare: Pays for the cost of inpatient rehabilitation provided the patient meets criteria at admission and during their stay. The medical director determines if the stays meets criteria and that determination is subject to review by Medicare.

Private insurance/Medicaid:

Pre-authorization and benefits are verified prior to admission however, this does not guarantee payment. Your case worker/social worker will work throughout your stay with insurance to obtain continued authorization.

Private Pay: Private payment may be arranged through a financial counselor at the hospital after administrative review and acceptance.

PROGRAM SATISFACTION

Patients, physicians and referral sources participating in the program should receive a satisfaction survey relating to their involvement in the program. The responses from these surveys are utilized along with other data to make adjustments and enhancements in the program and environment. A patient will receive a follow-up survey from NRC Health (email, text, or automated phone call) on behalf of the facility. For 2023, our facility has an overall net promotor score of 71.7. We had 23% of total patients discharged participate in the completion of a follow-up survey. For stroke care, our facility aftercare likelihood to recommend score was 100%.

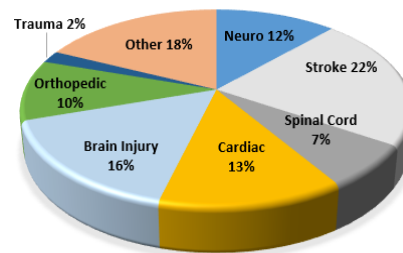

SETTING GOALS

Patients admitted to the Community Stroke & Rehabilitation Center receive assessment and evaluation to develop a plan of treatment. Our highly skilled team consists of a physicians, nurses, physical, occupational and speech therapists, psychologists, dietitians and a social workers who help to design a personalized treatment plan. The team meets on a weekly basis to discuss progress of each patient and to revise or update goals as appropriate.

The Rehabilitation Center staff use a Quality Indicator (QI) system for in-depth studies of patient outcomes. Patients are scored on admission, at discharge and during a 90-day follow-up telephone call. The "amount of gain" represents the functional improvement in self-care and mobility from time of admission to discharge. We anticipate an increase in function in the range of 40-48 points. Our overall target is 44.
